1. Introduction

Nepal is in the fourth position among the South Asian countries in terms of drug abuse, said anti-drug abuse experts and rehabilitation officials. It is found that abusers are also seen of younger in age, and nearly 150,000 abusers including teenagers, adolescents and adults were directly or indirectly addicted to drug use. According to report of UNODC, nearly 200 million people are using illicit drugs such as cocaine, cannabis, hallucinogens, opiates and sedative hypnotics worldwide. Of the total drug abusers in Nepal, 107,000 were among school and college students the government report based on 2006 had, however, shows that there are 46,309 drug abusers in Nepal. According to Narconon-Nepal, about 1 million drug abusers are already in critical condition that poses difficulty to recover. In country wise data, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Nepal are respectively in second, third and fourth position in abuse of drugs. Bhutan has the greatest control on drug abuse in the region. On June 6, Nepal Police Headquarters collaboration with Narconon-Nepal launched a nationwide campaign against drug abuse after taking consent from the Home Ministry.

In addition, Drug abuse among youth is of rising concern. Initiation into drugs begins often during teenage years and usually peaks between 18 to 25 years. Peer pressure, curiosity, and lack of awareness are often cited as the main reasons for youth getting involved in drug use. It is therefore essential to generate awareness and organize programs in schools and colleges about the ill effects of drug abuse and addiction. So, this organization has also taken consideration about this serious matter and conducted youth and school focused awareness program and are submitting this report to the fund proving office (Drug abuse Control Program). There were almost 100 students participated in this program of Lincoln College.

2. **Objective:**

The objective of the program was to aware the youth against drugs abuse, its harms, risks, and ways to be saved.

3. **Method:**

The awareness program was implemented through showing a Video and giving lectures.
